Katie is an award-winning writer and actress. She's a BAFTA Rocliffe TV Comedy Winner and was on the BBC Comedy Writersroom and Soho Theatre Writers Lab. She is currently listed on the BBC New Talent Hot List.

Her short film *Ghosted* which she co-wrote, produced and performed in, received the BFI Network award in association with Film Hub Midlands and went into commissioned development for TV.

Her debut audio drama *Yellow Lips* aired on BBC Radio 4 in 2021, in which she plays the lead, was nominated for The Imison Award.

Her debut stage play *Tapped* went into production at Theatre503 in 2022 and went on a UK regional tour in 2023. It was published by Nick Hern books and Katie received an Offie nomination for Most Promising New Playwright.

Katie is currently a writer in residence with Theatre Centre and has projects for TV, stage and radio in commissioned development.

In this time, we've commissioned 108 writers and produced 237 plays. We have played to audiences of over 1 million in schools and theatres and we have worked with over 250,000 young people through a vast range of projects.
